NOT COMING DOWN - THE PROJECT (Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 1:2-10)

- 1. Did your family growing up have family meetings? If so, what where they like?
- 2. How important do you think it is to know why you do something? Check out this clip from comedian Michael Jr on knowing our why; https://youtu.be/1ytFB8TrkTo
- 3. What do you believe is the why behind what we do as a church? In other words, what is the reason we do what we do?
- 4. Where in scripture do we find our why as Christians? (1 Corinthians 12:12-27, Acts 1:8, Matthew 28:18-20, Acts 2:42, 1 Peter 3:15, James 1:27)
- 5. Are you on board with that?
- 6. Read 1 Thessalonians 1:2-10 from several different Bible translations in your group. Why does Paul thank God for these Thessalonian believers?
- 7. What does it mean to be an imitator of the Lord?
- 8. Verse 8 says, "The Lord's message rang out from you" or in a different translation "the word of the Lord sounded forth from you." What do you think this means?
- 9. And, what does it mean for us as individuals? And, us as a church body?
- 10. Explain how you would connect the new building project to Jesus.
- 11. For the Pickerington, South and Chapel groups, please take some time to discuss the upcoming project. What does that project mean for you and your family?

SHEPHERDING / CARE / PRAYER

The Apostle Paul often found himself having to write to groups of new Christians and provided them with a number of helpful hints. These helpful hints can be put to good use within your Grace group and can be summarized as follows:

- 1. Each member of the group needs to accept every other member without judgement and criticism.
- 2. Members must encourage and exhort one another. This includes comforting and getting alongside each member so that they feel that there is someone who understands and cares for them. It also includes encouraging others to get on and do what God is calling them to do.
- 3. Be patient with one another and be quick to forgive each other.
- 4. We must serve one another in love, taking on another's burdens.
- 5. Caring requires us to be humble we need to value others above ourselves. We need to have servant hearts. As someone once said: "Humility is the soil in which the harvest of love can grow."
