ACHILLES HEEL - A STUDENT OF HISTORY (Scripture: Proverbs 27:12, 1 Corinthians 10:6-12)

- 4. Are you a history buff? If so, what's your favorite type of history?
- 5. Do you think about your past much?
- 6. Read this week's scriptures. In Paul's first letter to the Corinthian church, he's pointing out here that the Israelites didn't learn from God's instructions and were harshly dealt with. He's saying that they should learn from the mistake's of the past in order to not make the same ones. What thoughts do these warnings provoke for you?
- 7. What were some of the mistakes the Israelites made, not only from these passages, but from other Old Testament passages?
- 8. What's a mistake from your past that you have learned from?
- 9. There are many predictable **events** in our lives. Our **response** to those predictable events can affect the **outcome** in a positive or negative way. What's a predictable event in your life that you wish you would respond to in a more God-honoring way? (leader note; remember our discussion about E+R=O? This will be sprinkled into the message guides as we move throughout the group season.)
- 10. It was said in the weekend message to be a student of your own history and the history of others. How can you learn from your past?
- 11. Have you allowed Jesus to forgive our past?
- 12. Do you realize you have a future powered by your faith in Christ?

ACTION STEP

The action step out of the weekend message was to look at your past in order to learn from it and avoid mistakes.

SHEPHERDING / CARE / PRAYER

An important part of group life is caring for your group members.
