What is your normal morning routine? Do you get up and make your bed, or do you leave it undone?

Read Acts 9: 32 – 42. Note the word “saints” in 9:32 is the same Greek word translated “believers” in 9:41. According to the New Testament, what then is a definition of a “saint”? Although the word saint is only used four times in Acts, Paul uses it frequently in reference to all who are believers in Jesus. Since you are a “saint” how should you be living your life?

What is the purpose of these signs and wonders (vv. 35, 41 – 42; see also Acts 2:22, 43, Acts 4:30 and 5: 12- 14)?

Although Peter had healed many people, he had never raised anyone from the dead. What might he be feeling as he goes to Tabitha’s house?

Which of Jesus’ miracles do these two incidents remind you of?

What are the “keys” to Peter doing these miracles, (vv. 9:34 & 9:40)?

How does the miracle with Tabitha compare to Jesus’ miracle with Jairus’ daughter found in Mark 5: 21 – 43? Who was with Jesus in the Mark passage (vv. 5:37)?

Would you say your prayer life is great or in need of some improvement? What would it take to improve it?

Do you ever pray for the impossible like Peter did? Why or why not?

Take time to pray for one another and don’t be afraid to pray big!
