The Success Principles—by Jack Canfield

3 components to any challenging situation:

The Event I cannot change this
The Response I am responsible for this
The Outcome I try to influence this

E + R = O

When we set boundaries for how others can influence us, sometimes we must:

- 1. Leave a situation
- 2. Take a stand

2. We must define how we will influence ourselves.
