

Small Group Discussion Questions

“With Your God - 01. Act Justly” (Micah 6:8)

1. In the sermon, we learned that the prophet Micah came from a tiny, quiet countryside town called Moresheth—a place most people just quickly drove past without noticing. Why do you think God chose a regular person from a small, overlooked town to speak such an important message to the nation? What does this tell us about the kinds of people God uses?

2. The sermon used the picture of a healthy tree to show how our faith works: its roots grow deep into the soil of worship and prayer, while its branches reach wide out into the sunlight of justice and mercy.

- What happens to a tree if it only has roots but no branches?
- What happens if it has branches but no deep roots?
- How can we make sure we are growing in *both* directions in our own lives?

3. Theologian Cornel West said that **“Justice is what love looks like in public.”** When Jesus talked to the religious leaders in Matthew 23:23, He told them they were doing a great job with private religious rules (like tithing their garden herbs) but were completely ignoring the “more important matters” like justice and mercy. What do you think it looks like for a Christian to show God’s love “in public” today?

4. Micah pointed out that injustice happens when people use their power, smarts, or resources to look out only for themselves while ignoring the pain of others. If we ask the Holy Spirit to give us “new eyes” this week, where do we see people being left out, lonely, or treated unfairly in our schools, workplaces, or neighborhoods?

5. The sermon concluded with an invitation not to start with a massive, overwhelming plan, but simply to “start with the walk” alongside God. What is one small, practical way you can hold God’s hand and show His love to someone who is struggling or unnoticed this week?
