It's easy to transfer stocks as a gift to SPC. You can transfer appreciated stock to SPC without recognizing capital gains on the appreciation. Basically, you'll make a larger donation than you could make with cash and receive a larger tax benefit.

## Here's how it works:

- 1. You transfer your publicly-traded stocks, bonds or mutual fund shares that you have owned for more than one year to Sammamish Presbyterian Church
- 2. We sell the stocks immediately and use the funds to support the ministry and ministry of our church.

## **Your Benefits:**

- The IRS will allow you to take a tax deduction for the fair market value of your gift on the date of transfer, regardless of what you originally paid for the stocks.
- No capital gains are owed on the transfer.
- The value of supporting kingdom work at SPC!

## **Important Details**

Consult your tax advisor and make plans when you prepare to sell stocks and mutual funds. Timing is important to make sure you receive the benefit in the year you intend to give. Transfer date, post marked date (if mailed via U.S. Postal Service), or date of receipt by SPC, may affect tax year eligibility.
