# A Message From Our Church Librarian



The Elephant in the Room: New Library Books on a Controversial Issue by Margaret Hogue As our church's librarian, I felt that we needed to have some books on the topic of Christianity and homosexuality. I looked at many books available and selected some that represented the issue from different viewpoints and were reviewed well. The following items have now been added to the Library and can be found in the "Social Issues" category. If you know of others that would be useful for increasing knowledge on the topic, please let me know.

### Living Faithfully: Human Sexuality and the United Methodist Church

a Four Week Small Group Study; by Jill Johnson & others, c. 2019. Living Faithfully is designed to help understand the shape of the current debate and what it means for the present and the future. Each chapter includes background on the Bible, Christian theology, history, stories from diverse viewpoints, and United Methodist structure and practice to guide reflection and conversation. This study contains a chapter that

### Christianity and Homosexuality Reconciled: New Thinking for a New Millennium

describes the outcome of the 2019 General Conference and the ongoing debates and responses to it.

by Rev. Joseph Pearson, c. 2021.

This book presents biological, historical, and scriptural aspects for understanding the reconciliation of Christianity and homosexuality from a Christian evangelical perspective.

### Two Views on Homosexuality, the Bible and the Church

ed. By Preston Sprinkle, c. 2016.

This book brings a fresh perspective to a well-worn debate. It seeks to give much-needed attention to the rich history of Christian tradition, bringing the Bible into conversation with historical and systematic theology. Scholars articulate and defend each of the opposing views. There are also responses to the essays.

### Holy Love: A Biblical Theology for Human Sexuality

by Steve Harper, c. 2019.

The author strives to articulate the truth about the teachings of the Bible and Wesleyan tradition on human sexuality. The book will help church leaders and small groups make the constructive case that biblical, Christian teaching is compatible with faithful, covenantal love and intimacy amidst all sexual orientations.

### God and the Gay Christian: The Biblical Case in Support of Same-Sex Relationships

by Matthew Vines, c. 2014.

This is a landmark book that explores what the Bible actually says—and doesn't say—about same-sex relationships. Feeling the tension between his understanding of the Bible and the reality of his same-sex orientation, the author devoted years of intensive research into what the Bible says about homosexuality.


