Delight - A Walk Through the Psalms - Psalms 1-30

Psalm 6 - A Prayer for Rescue

Is God's discipline the cause of your present trouble? Rebuke - Repentance - Return - Relief

Biblical Principle:

Sin will make you sick. (Emotionally, mentally, spiritually, physically) Repentance can make you well.

Psalm 7 - A Request for Justice

"...God looks deep into the mind and heart." (vs. 9b)

1.Be upright in your mind and heart.

2. Work at righteousness in all matters.

3.Leave others to God.

Biblical Principle:

When we truly follow God, He rewards our efforts. Thankfulness and praise bring stability.

Psalm 8 - The Greatness of God

This passage praises God for His amazing power, majesty, and creation. It also marvels that God would be mindful of us and the great worth He has placed on us. God also desires for us partner with Him (putting us in charge) of His creation.

Biblical Principle:

God created us with great value and worth. He has given us responsibility to care for creation.

Psalm 9 - God is our Refuge

Psalm 9 is a mix of praise and petition; celebration and setback. David is praising God (vs 1-2) for His power over his enemies (vs 3-8) and continual presence with David during the battle (vs 9-12).

Biblical Principle:

God is a refuge for the godly during unjust and evil times. He does not forsake those who trust in Him.

<u>Psalm 10 - There is Hope for the Helpless</u>

"God IS a very present help in trouble! But God also permits trouble to pursue us...that we may be brought to the end of ourselves and led to discover the treasures of darkness and immeasurable gains of tribulation." - Mrs. Charles Cowman (Streams in the Desert)

Biblical Principle:

God sees it all and He will act according to His plans, His purposes and in His perfect timing.
