# This is Us What About Unbelievers? 2 Timothy 2:24-26

**Genesis 2** <sup>18</sup> It is not good for the man to be alone. (NIV)

**Proverbs 12** <sup>26</sup> The righteous choose their friends carefully, but the way of the wicked leads them astray. (NIV)

- 1 Corinthians 15 33 Do not be misled: "Bad company corrupts good character." (NIV)
- **2 Corinthians 6** <sup>14</sup> Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers. For what partnership has righteousness with lawlessness? Or what fellowship has light with darkness? (ESV)

## 1. We need to be a light and a blessing to unbelievers.

**Matthew 5** <sup>16</sup> In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. (NIV)

## 2. We need to be wise in our friendships with unbelievers.

**Colossians 4** <sup>5</sup> Live wisely among those who are not believers, and make the most of every opportunity. (NLT)

**Ephesians 5** <sup>15</sup> Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, <sup>16</sup> making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. <sup>17</sup> Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is.

## 3. We need to be patient and kind to unbelievers.

**2 Timothy 2** <sup>24</sup> The Lord's servant must not quarrel, but must be gentle to everyone, able to teach, and patient, <sup>25</sup> instructing his opponents with gentleness. Perhaps God will grant them repentance leading them to the knowledge of the truth. <sup>26</sup> Then they may come to their senses and escape the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will. (CSB)

**1 Peter 3** <sup>15</sup> Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect. (NIV)

### 4. We need to pray in intercession for unbelievers.

**James 5** <sup>16</sup> The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. (NIV)

**2 Peter 3** <sup>9</sup> The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.

**Matthew 9** <sup>9</sup> As Jesus went on from there, He saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow me," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him. (NIV)

**Matthew 9** <sup>11</sup> When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" (NIV)

**Matthew 9** <sup>12</sup> Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. <sup>13</sup> But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."(NIV)
