QUESTION 11:

"In Romans 13, it speaks of submission to the governing authorities. And in the 10 Commandments it says, 'Thou shalt not kill.' So what about someone who has been sentenced to death? How do we as Christians explain that?"

1. God is the _____ of His creation.

"The LORD has established his throne in heaven, and his kingdom rules over all." Psalm 103:19

"God reigns over the nations; God is seated on his holy throne." Psalm 47:8

"Thou shalt not kill." Exodus 20:13 KJV

"You shall not murder." Exodus 20:13

2. God ordains that we should _____ to our earthly rulers.

"Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves." Romans 13:1-2

"For the one in authority is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for rulers do not bear the sword for no reason. They are God's servants, agents of wrath to bring punishment on the wrongdoer. Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience." Romans 13:4-5

"Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme authority, or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right." 1 Peter 2:13-14

3. Human justice is _____ without God's righteousness.

"Whoever sheds human blood, by humans shall their blood be shed; for in the image of God has God made mankind." Genesis 9:6

"Whoever strikes a man so that he dies shall be put to death." Exodus 21:12 ESV

"But never put a person to death on the testimony of only one witness. There must always be two or three witnesses." Deuteronomy 17:6 NLT

"Every matter must be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses." 2 Corinthians 13:1

4. We must remember that _____ extends to all, even those we judge most harshly.

"We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus answered him, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise." Luke 23:41-43
