Summer 2022 June Sunday School Lessons & Questions

June 5: Convicted by the Spirit (John 15: 26-27; John 16:7-15)

Main Point: The Holy Spirit convicts us of sin and points us to the truth of Salvation.

- How would you define or describe sin ?
- What are some ways the Holy Spirit speaks to us?
- What do these verses teach us about Jesus' righteousness? Our own?

June 12: Born Again by the Spirit (John 3:1-8, 14-17)

Main Point: The Holy Spirit brings us into a new life as we place our trust in Jesus.

- What are some ways people try to earn their way into Heaven? Why is it impossible?
- How is being born again a good metaphor for salvation?
- How has trusting Jesus changed in your life?

June 19: Indwelt by the Spirit (Romans 8:9-17)

Main Point: The Holy Spirit's presence in our lives affirms our relationship with God.

- How can we better recognize the leading of the Holy Spirit?
- What does it mean to you that you are a child of God?
- How does the Holy Spirit help followers of Jesus?

June 26: Filled with the Spirit (Ephesians 5:8-21)

Main Point: The Holy Spirit enables us to live as fully devoted disciples.

- What does it look like to walk in darkness?
- What is the differences between wise and foolish living, particularly as related to the Holy Spirit?
- How do you show God your gratitude for who He is and what He does in your life?

July 3: Considering Others (1 Corinthians 10:23-33)

Main Point: Let your responsibility to others drive how you exercise your rights.

- Why can it be difficult to focus on others instead of ourselves?
- What does this passage teach us about making choices for the good of others?
- How can the glory of God practically serve as a filter for how we live our lives?

July 10: Walking With the Spirit (Galatians 5:16-25)

Main Point: The Holy Spirit leads us to display the fruit of godly character.

- What are some obstacles that keep us from being led by the spirit?
- How have you seen following the flesh produce difficult consequences in your life and in others?
- In your own words what does it mean to keep in step with the spirit?

July 17: United Through the Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:4-14)

Main Point: The Holy Spirit brings us together as one church.

- How can disunity negatively affect the work of the church for God's kingdom?
- What is the value of having so many different spiritual gifts in the church?
- How is the human body a good metaphor for the church?

July 24: Who is Your Neighbor? (Luke 10:25-37)

Main Point: Love compels us to be the neighbor others need.

- What are some things people do to try and earn eternal life?
- Why might we look past other people's problems rather than help them?
- What might it cost us to love someone who is in need?

July 31: What Does Love Look Like? (1 Corinthians 13:1-13)

Main Point: We are to love others as God loves us.

- Why is religious activity meaningless without love?
- How does God show patience with us?
- How does our love for others reveal God's love?

August 7: Pray for Your Neighbor (1 Timothy 2:1-8)

Main Point: Love your neighbors by taking their needs to God in prayer.

- What do you find challenging about prayer?
- What kind of attitudes can affect our prayers for others?
- How are prayer and love tied together?

August 14: Honor Your Neighbor (Romans 12:9-21)

Main Point: Love is seen in the ways we honor others.

- How do we respond when treated unfairly? How should we respond?
- How is the passage countercultural to what we see in the world today?
- How should we relate to those who have wronged us?

August 21: Forgive Your Neighbor (Matthew 18:21-35)

Main Point: Love leads us to forgive.

- What are some consequences of refusing to forgive?
- How has receiving forgiveness helped you forgive others?
- How can we forgive people who have offended us in big ways?

August 28: Share Christ with Your Neighbor (John 1:40-49)

Main Point: We love our neighbors when we tell them about Jesus.

- What can hold us back from telling others about Jesus?
- What makes our testimony an effective tool when sharing the gospel?
- What is our responsibility when it comes to sharing Jesus with others?
