

MESSAGE NOTES

"Explosion: Pt. 6—First Journey/Our Journey" Acts 13-14



#1. WE ARE MISSIONARIES BY GOD'S WORK.

- Cyprus: "they were sent on their way by the Holy Spirit." (13:1-12)
- Pisidian: "all who were appointed for eternal life [by God] believed." (13:48)
- Iconium: "the Lord confirmed the message by enabling them to perform signs." (14:3)
- Lystra: The Lord's healing of a lame man. (14:10)
- Antioch: "they...reported all that God had done through them and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles." (14:27)

#2. WE ARE MISSIONARIES WITH THE GOSPEL MESSAGE.

- Pisidian: Jesus' crucifixion, resurrection, exaltation and Messiahship for the forgiveness of sins and based on that he calls them to believe. (13:23-41)

#3. WE ARE MISSIONARIES IN PROGRESS AND PERSECUTION.

a. The progress:

- Cyprus: They preached everywhere and the proconsul believed.
- Pisidian: "The word of the Lord spread through the whole region." (13:49)
- Iconium: "a great number of Jews and Greeks believed." (14:1)
- Derbe: "They preached the gospel...and won a large number of disciples." (14:21)

b. The persecution:

- Cyprus: The sorcerer Elymas.
- Pisidian: Jealousy, contradiction, abuse, being expelled. (13:42-52)
- Iconium: "a plot afoot...to mistreat them and stone them." (14:5)
- Lystra: "They stoned Paul and dragged him out...thinking he was dead." (14:20)
- All cities: "We must go through many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." (14:22)

#4. WE ARE MISSIONARIES WHO BUILD AND FOR REINFORCE.

- All cities: strengthening by encouragement; that reminder to persevere through hardships; appointing elder leadership; time to report and celebrate at home. (14:21-28)

WE ARE MISSIONARIES BY GOD'S WORK AND WORD WITH OUR FRUITFUL, HARD WORK AND REINFORCING ENCOURAGEMENT.
