

Crossroads Sermon Study TBH: The Head Mess John 21:1-19 April 30, 2023

Lean In: Do you like to fish? Why or why not? Share a fishing story.

Look In: Read John 21:1-19 aloud together and write verse 17-18 in your journal.

Look Back: What stood out to you most about this week's teaching? What questions do you have? What encouraged you? What challenged you? What comforted you?

Take it Deeper:

- 1. Peter jumped into the water and swam *toward* Jesus (as opposed to away). What might this indicate about Peter's thoughts/beliefs about Jesus after his denial? What might this indicate what Peter thought/believed about himself?
- 2. Read Matthew 26:31-33. "More than these" could have been referring to Peter's bold claim to be more devoted than any of the disciples. Or perhaps "these" referred to his life as a fisherman? What do you think? Are there any bold claims in your life that you may need to examine in the presence of Jesus?
- 3. Is there anything in your life that has prevented you from answering this one question, "Do you love me?" Have you feared that your failure or your sin has been a sign of your lack of love for Jesus? Where in your life have you made following Jesus about competency more than intimacy?
- 4. The sin in Peter's life messed with his head and what he thought was true. Have you ever thought, "how could a mess like me follow Jesus?" Have you ever tried to "make it up to Jesus?" What truth do you need to proclaim over these thoughts?
- 5. "Jesus Christ asks each one of us, not for obedience primarily, not for repentance, not for vows, not for conduct, but for a heart; and that being given, all the rest will follow." (Alexander Maclaren) What is your response to this statement?
- 6. If you were in a conversation with God this week, how would you finish the sentence about your current life's circumstance? "Tbh ______." How do you imagine God might answer your honest confession based on today's message?

Look Up: Father, I confess that I want answers and you want intimacy. I want the directions and you want me to walk with You. I want solutions and You want me to trust. Forgive me for treating you like a distant, uninterested, uncaring God, when all along you have been inviting me close. Help me to draw near to you and honestly answer the question you have been asking me.
