

Dear Christ UMC family and friends,

September is going to be packed full of opportunities to connect and learn.

We will be celebrating our stewardship process including having a O & A opportunity about the budget or finances on Sunday, September 25 between worship services in the fellowship hall.

Confirmation will begin (if the schedule works with those interested) on the 3rd Sunday, Sept. 18th, at 3pm.

The big news nationally for the UMC continues to be congregations leaving the United Methodist Church primarily because of issues of lgbtq+ inclusion.

I have been asked when we will have a vote but, as I have shared, unless there is a large percentage of our congregation wanting to leave the denomination, there is nothing to vote on. To help foster communication, we will have two Town Hall meetings: Sunday, September 18th at 12:15p.m. and Tuesday, September 20th at 7p.m. in the Sanctuary. Pastor Bruce and I will share information about what disaffiliation is, how the cost is calculated, and invite you to participate in an informal poll to help us all get a better picture of where our congregation is on the spectrum of Conservative Non Compatible/ Conservative Compatible/ Progressive Compatible/ Progressive Non Compatible (these will be explained at the Town Halls).

We will live stream the Sunday meeting to our Christ UMC Connect private Facebook Group. A link to the informal poll will be available on that stream and responses will be collected until Noon on September 23rd. Anyone can participate in the informal poll. If an official vote is needed at a later date, that would be for members only.

I am hopeful that we will be able to move through these conversations and help everyone know they are loved and welcome at Christ UMC. As United Methodists we are grounded in a theology of Grace and we want to ensure that all find belonging and community in our church, no matter where you are theologically.


God, I want to honor
