It's hard for me to grasp that the year 2023 is almost over! Where has the time gone? In this last year we have accomplished much in mission and ministry here at Sulphur Grove. On October 1 of this year, we saw the launch of the Bridge of Hope Church at the former Brandt UMC campus. We saw the opening of Lifewise Academy which is using our Bridge of Hope facility to conduct its classes reaching out to elementary grade students in the Bethel School District. We also added Dinner at the Bridge, a "dinner church" model of worship at the Bridge as well. All this was done in line with our mission of "Making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." Thanks to all who helped bring this vision into reality. Please continue to pray for the Bridge of Hope and its mission to reach people in the Brandt, Carriage Trails, and Bethel Township areas.

The hard news is that 2023 has been a difficult financial year for Sulphur Grove (SG). Throughout the winter and spring seasons, we managed to not run a deficit in giving vs. expenditures. However, since summer the deficit has steadily increased. Giving historically drops at SG during the summer months and then recovers after school starts. That recovery did not happen this year. As I write (11/15), we currently have a deficit of \$50,000 plus. We have taken steps to cut costs where we can, such as not printing bulletins, but the reality is most of our costs are "fixed." We can do little to change the costs of electricity, gas, trash disposal, or the costs of staff without layoffs.

Part of the deficit could be the nearly \$40,000 final cost of the recent roof replacement. There is a possibility that some people designated their "normal giving" to the roof versus to the budget. Also remember that about one-half of the roof replacement cost was covered by the Dybvad memorial gift. So the deficit cannot be attributed totally to the roof replacement. Another possible reason is the poor state of our U.S. economy. The compounding effects of recent high inflation rates have taken a toll on everyone. Deaths of faithful givers and retirements have also impacted the church. I can say with my wife Diane's retirement in June, we had to drop our giving to the church by 33% or \$100 per week. Sadly, we have also lost some folks over the homosexuality issue who moved to churches more in line with their beliefs on this matter. The sum of all this has led to a decrease in giving to Sulphur Grove. And just to answer any questions that might arise about management of the church funds please know this. This is not a result of mismanagement. Our overall costs this year are lower than they were in 2022.

I share this with you to make you aware that if giving continues at its current level, we will have to make some significant and unpleasant cuts in staff hours or even the elimination of staff positions. We will likely have to reduce the amount of financial support given to the several mission efforts we support. Please do not take this as a threat or attempt to force anyone into giving more money as it is not. I understand the financial strain many are feeling right now. I feel it too. I share this information only to make you aware of where we are financially and prepare you for cuts that may have to be made in the 2024 budget.

I am praying that November and December will be very good giving months that will eliminate or significantly reduce our current deficit. I invite you to join me in prayer for the finances of our beloved church. I am confident that together, with God's help, we will get through this financial famine.

A NEW WAY OF COMMUNICATING

Beginning January 2024, Sulphur Grove is going to send communications to you a little differently than in the past.

The monthly newsletter will be sent via email to everyone who would usually get it through the postal mail. This means that if you get the newsletter mailed to you, you will now need to check your email rather than the mailbox. If you already receive the newsletter electronically, there is nothing you need to do. This will be the last issue that will be mailed to you.

If we do not have your email on file, it will be crucial that you provide it, otherwise you will miss out on all that is happening within the church. It will also be important to keep us up to date if your email changes.

The same will go for the yearly Easter and Christmas time letters, and any special letter that may have to go out during the year. These will also be emailed out to everyone. Those letters with special offering envelopes included, the envelopes will be made available in the church or offerings can be made online. Stay tuned for further information regarding how to give online.

One of the main reasons for doing this is to keep costs down. With everything becoming more expensive, it is important to be mindful of our spending, including the cost of paper, envelopes, ink for the printers, and wear and tear on the machines.

Again, it will be vital for you to make sure that we have your email address on file.



If you would no longer like to receive the newsletter at all, please let us know and we'll take care of the rest.

This will not affect the weekly bulletins, announcements, and prayer and flower lists. This will only affect pieces that are mailed directly to your homes. This also will not affect the yearly directory.

Thank you for your understanding while we move forward into new ways to communicate with everyone as well as being good stewards and being mindful of rising costs.
