Sulphur Grove has been presented with a unique opportunity regarding the use of the church farm I want to share with you. Amy Brooks, a few others, and I have been in discussion with a solar power company regarding building a solar generation facility on 40-60 acres of the church farm. Currently, only 44 of the 88 total acres are in crop production which generates around \$5,000 per year in income. I understand the remaining 44 acres is scrub brush and is sparsely populated with trees. We pay taxes on that unproductive land. So turning that 44 acres into income producing land might be a good idea.

As one who grew up in a farming community I, along with others, am quite sensitive to the loss of land for crop production. As a result, one of my questions for the solar company was, "Are you willing to use the undeveloped 44 acres for a solar farm?" Their reply was, "Yes." So, if we choose to do so, the farmed portion of land can remain as cropland.

The term of the contract being proposed is 25 years with the option to renew the contract in 5 year intervals up to four times. If every option is exercised, the total term of the contract could be up to 45 years. So, this is a long-term commitment. Now the part everyone has likely been waiting for and that is, how much income would a 40 acre solar farm generate? Well, I am not in a position to give you exact numbers. However, once the <u>solar farm is generating power</u>, the solar company would pay the church many multiples of what we currently receive in rent per acre on the farmland. The contract also includes a 2% per year increase in the rental fee for the life of the contract. While the solar farm is under construction, the rent is less, but we still get more than we would in cropland rent. (It takes about 2 years to build the solar facility.)

I share this with you to ask that you be in prayer regarding this proposal. It could provide significant income for Sulphur Grove and the Bridge campus. I understand there will likely be concerns, like the loss of green space and what will the farm's neighbors think of a solar farm near them? Or where will the electricity that is generated be sent? Will it stay locally or be sent to some far off city? I assure you the leadership board is considering all these things.

One final caveat. Proposed legislation regarding solar farms here in Ohio *will need to be passed* before any of this can happen. If the legislation does not pass, this proposal becomes moot. I do not know the details of the proposed legislation. It may or may not be good for Ohioans. I have to trust our elected representatives to do what is best for all Ohioans.

As you pray about this proposal, please also pray that the leadership board will be able to discern God's will for in this matter for our church.


WHAT'S NEXT?

On Palm Sunday, our Sunday School Class finished our six-week study "The Walk" by Rev. Adam Hamilton. The first two Sundays in April we will be finishing our study of "The Questions Jesus Asked" by Rev. Margrey deVega. Since we are finishing up things, that begs the question, What's next? Well, next on our "To Do" list is "Stories Jesus Told", a six-week study lead by Dr. Greg Carey that will explore six of Jesus' parables to learn how to read, interpret, and live them in your daily life.

Dr. Carey says "We love stories. That's why we go to movies, read books, and listen to friends recount an experience. That's also why teachers use the technique of storytelling to make a difficult concept easier for us to process. Jesus told stories, or parables, for that very reason—and to help us understand how God wants us to live life. Sometimes, however, stories like the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son can be interpreted in more than one way. Even Bible scholars are divided on their meanings."

The new study will begin Sunday, April 21. We expect to have the new books in classroom 302 by Sunday, April 7. If you wish to reimburse the church the cost of the book, the cost is \$15.99 per copy. It is also available from Cokesbury as an eBook and from Amazon as a hard copy or a Kindle electronic version.


