Opening Thoughts

- Who in your life “really knows you”? How do they respond when you’re not being fully honest?
- Why do you think we try to hide our true feelings or struggles from others—and from God?

God Sees Our Flaws — Jeremiah 19:1–11, Genesis 3:8–11

- What are some ways we try to “cover up” our flaws or sins?
- How does it feel to know that God sees your flaws but still loves you?
- What does Genesis 3 teach us about human nature and our tendency to hide?

God Sees Our Future — Jeremiah 29:4–7, 11–14

- How does knowing God has a plan for your future bring comfort—or challenge?
- What does it mean to “seek the peace and prosperity of the city” in our context?
- How can we trust God’s vision when our current situation feels uncertain?

God Sees Our Need to Be Formed — Jeremiah 18:1–12

- God sees our need to be formed...do we?
- What does the image of the potter and clay teach us about God’s role in our lives?
- Have you ever resisted being reshaped by God? What happened?

God Sees Our Fullness — Jeremiah 33:6–11

- What’s the difference between how we fix broken things and how God restores us?
- What would it look like for you to live as someone who has been beautifully restored by God this week?
