Ice Breaker: Is it possible to have sight and still be blind? Explain.

Read: Mark 10:46-52, Luke 4:14-19, John 9:1-41

Discussion Questions:

- Opening Thoughts
 - Have you ever been surprised by what someone else was able to “see” that you missed? How so
 - Where in your life do you suspect your vision might be blurred—toward God, toward yourself, or toward others?
- Living With Blindness (Mark 10:46–47)
 - What are examples of “spiritual blindness” you’ve experienced personally?
 - Why do you think spiritual blindness can be harder to acknowledge than physical blindness? How does acknowledging our blindness take humility?
 - Bartimaeus cried out when he realized Jesus was near. What cries — prayers, confessions, needs — might you be holding back?
 - What does “generational blindness” mean to you?
 - Are there things your parents or community couldn’t see that God is now revealing to you?
- Leaving Behind What Supports Blindness (Mark 10:48–50; Luke 4:14–19)
 - Why do you think Bartimaeus threw off his cloak before coming to Jesus?
 - What “cloak” (comfort, habit, belief, relationship, fear) may be assisting your spiritual blindness?
 - What makes it difficult to leave behind things that have become familiar—even if they keep us from seeing clearly?
 - Jesus declared freedom to the blind in Luke 4. What do you need to be freed from?
- Learning to See and Follow (Mark 10:51-52)
 - Whom have you given permission to lead you through the dark?
 - Jesus asked Bartimaeus, “What do you want me to do for you?” — How would you answer that question today?
 - After receiving sight, Bartimaeus followed Jesus immediately. What step of obedience might God be asking you to take next?
- Closing Thoughts (John 9)
 - What is one area where you can say, “I see differently now because of Jesus”?
 - How are salvation and sight connected in your own story?
 - What would it look like for you to “see like Christ” at work, at home, or in your relationships?
 - How can your group help each other develop spiritual clarity?
 - How will you apply what you’ve learned this week?
