Discussion and Reflection Questions Sunday 24th of October 2021

Read: Mark 10:46-52

⁴⁶ They came to Jericho. As he and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside. ⁴⁷ When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!' ⁴⁸ Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, 'Son of David, have mercy on me!' ⁴⁹ Jesus stood still and said, 'Call him here.' And they called the blind man, saying to him, 'Take heart; get up, he is calling you.' ⁵⁰ So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. ⁵¹ Then Jesus said to him, 'What do you want me to do for you?' The blind man said to him, 'My teacher, let me see again.' ⁵² Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has made you well.' Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.

Discussion and reflection Questions

- 1. What titles have you been given in your life and how has it impacted on your senses of place identity and status
- 2. When has been a time when you felt compelled to speak up when others have wanted you to stay silent? When have you remained silent (for better and/or worse)?
- 3. How would you answer the question if Jesus asked you: 'What do you want me to do for you?'
- 4. How does God show mercy?
- 5. What have you been blind to that a relationship with Jesus has helped you to see more clearly?
