Read: Luke 23.33-43

there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴ Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to divide his clothing. ³⁵ And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' ³⁶ The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, ³⁷ and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' ³⁸ There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.' ³⁹ One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' ⁴⁰ But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? ⁴¹ And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.' ⁴² Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' ⁴³ He replied, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.'

- 2. What does or has 'Christ the King' meant for you?
- 3. Jesus talks most about 'the kingdom of God'. What do you think about when you hear the phrase 'kingdom of God'?
- 4. How do you cope with criticism? What about criticism of the church?
- 5. How does the kingdom of God contrast with a culture of individualism?
- 6. How does the kingdom of God contrast with a culture of compliance?
- 7. Only some believed & claimed Jesus as king. God can do a lot with just "some" how does that make you feel & think about the kingdom of God?
