Discussion and Reflection Questions Pentecost 22A - 29th of October 2023 Formed for the benefit of Others

Read: Matthew 22.34-46

- 34 When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together,
- 35 and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him.
- 36 'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?'
- ³⁷ He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind."
- 38 This is the greatest and first commandment.
- 39 And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself."
- 40 On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.'
- 41 Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question:
- 42 'What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?' They said to him, 'The son of David.'
- 43 He said to them, 'How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying,
- 44 "The Lord said to my Lord,
- 'Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet' "?
- 45 If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?'
- 46 No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

Discussion & Reflection Questions

- 1. Why do you think the Pharisees ask this question? What answer do you think they were hoping for?
- 2. What does it mean to love God with all your heart and how does that differ from loving God with your soul or your mind?
- 3. Verse 37 is part of the Shema a Jewish prayer said every morning and night. How could saying these words at the beginning & end of each day form you for the benefit of others.
- 4. Leviticus 19:11-18 is the basis for the second of the commandments. What does it mean to love your neighbour as yourself?
- 5. How could this commandment impact our world today?
- 6. Why do you think Jesus asks the question in verse 42?
- 7. How is Jesus different to the Messiah the Pharisees were expecting?
- 8. How is Jesus Messiah in your life?
