
Our Presbyterian church "family" dates from the Reformation era of the 1500's. Our opening hymn is among the earliest hymns from this era and has been sung by Presbyterians in various forms for centuries.

The prayer of confession stands at the heart of worship. We confess to God our misgivings and sin. We believe that through the mercy of Jesus Christ, our sins are forgiven. Our scriptures affirm this trust time and time again.

This response comes from Taizé, an ecumenical Christian monastic community in France, founded in 1940 by Brother Roger Schütz. The community has become one of the world's most important sites of modern Christian pilgrimage, with particular focus on youth. This simple song can be sung in unison or in canon.

Both of our scriptures today hold the phrase, "Here I am." This phrase is recorded as a response to the calling and presence of God. We believe that God is always "calling" people to acts of service, witness, and charity. Our sermon today will explore how hopefulness is discovered when we respond to God's call with faithful witness and joyfilled lives.

The three stanzas of Hymn 711 were written in 1962 by pastor Albert F. Bayly. While the author does not cite specific scripture that inspired the text, James 1:17 affirms that all good things come from God. Stanza one's references to giving make this an appropriate Offertory Response. It is paired with the same tune (TOULON) as our opening hymn.

CALENDAR FOR THE WEEK

ADORATION



The original French text, sometimes attributed to John Calvin, seems to be a Protestant reworking of a Roman Catholic hymn, not a typical practice for him. Yet this text and tune (adapted from GENEVAN 124) clearly date from the early years of the Reformed tradition.



The initial petition of this song is based on the language of Ephesians 1:18, while the second part draws on the account of Isaiah's vision in Isaiah 6:1–5. That event, in turn, is the basis of the threefold *Sanctus* that has become a traditional element in Christian worship.

CELEBRATING TIME



5 Time, like an ever rolling stream bears all our years away; they fly forgotten, as a dream dies at the opening day. 6 Our God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come, be thou our guard while life shall last, and our eternal home.

Many people sing this hymn unaware that it paraphrases Psalm 90, partly because this text speaks so immediately to the human condition. Since the middle of the 19th century, it has usually been joined to this tune named for the London parish where the composer was organist.
