One: How do we live for the love of God?

All: We love because God first loved us. God loves us in Christ with a love that never ends. We entrust ourselves to God's care: giving thanks each day for the wonderful goodness of God. Amazed by grace, we no longer live for ourselves. We live for the Lord who died and rose again, triumphant over death. Therefore, we take those around us to heart, especially those in need, knowing that Christ died for them no less than for us.

WMPC Adult Choir (merger of former Chancel and Sanctuary Choirs) and Youth Choir offer worship leadership today. Their musical offerings are prayers and praises to God on behalf of the entire worshipping community. Please join them in lifting your voices when the largest choir (the congregation) offers its sung prayer and praise.

Worship for Presbyterians should nearly always include an Affirmation of Faith: a statement of our theological core values and beliefs. In our history we have used catechisms as teaching tools for believers of all ages. We have been using this selection from the Study Catechism often over the past month.

We sing Hymn 611 as a hymn of praise. It is most often sung at weddings and services of witness to the resurrection (funerals). Today it is offered in thanksgiving to the joy God provides.







This text by a Presbyterian pastor in California expresses the conviction that being a good steward is an essential part of the Christian life, for self-giving is God's own nature. The tune is named for the village in Surrey where the arranger collected this tune in 1903.

This text was the winner in a hymn competition sponsored by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Bicentennial Committee for the 1988–1989 observance, which had the theme "Celebrate the Journey." The late 18th-century tune (first used with Psalm 148) is appropriately celebratory.

This well-known melody was created to provide a choral setting for J. C. F. von Schiller's poem, "An die Freude" (To Joy), as the final movement of the composer's *Ninth Symphony*. The author, a prominent Presbyterian pastor and author, wrote the words with this tune in mind.
