

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY - A MESSAGE FROM ERIC MILLER

The good news: WMPC volunteers had a productive, enjoyable wall building afternoon on January 7 in the Habitat for Humanity construction warehouse on Jones Sausage Road. There were eight of us from WMPC and members of the Divan Center, working alongside Presbyterians from congregations across Wake County. In a couple hours, we assembled with hammer and nails all of the exterior and interior walls of a two-story home to be built in the Old Poole Place neighborhood. The less good news: They will build them and they will not yet raise them. The City of Raleigh has not yet issued building permits to Habitat for constructing the homes at Old Poole Place for which we recently built walls. [The property is prepared, and walls have been delivered to the site.](#) We are not yet able to raise the walls. **Habitat has canceled all Old Poole Place construction for February, including our February 11, 2023 on-site date.** Currently, we still have our March 4, 2023 on-site date scheduled. Stay tuned for progress and opportunities to work with Habitat for Humanity as they arise. We all know how critical the housing needs are in our area, so let's hope this project gets constructed soon. Thank you for your engagement.




HEALING THROUGH GRIEF


