We begin with this wonderful hymn. Hymn 69 describes the covenant relationship between God and God's people. It reminds us of God's promises and our commitment to God in response to all God has done.

What would it mean for all of us to truly love "neighbors as self?" What would we need to do in order to follow Jesus into this difficult and challenging place?

Erik Routley (1917-82) was an ordained clergy in the Church of Scotland and later taught hymnology at Westminster Choir College, Princeton, New Jersey until his death. This hymn text was his first; it was inspired by the riots in Oakland, California, and other American cities in the 1960's. Disciples are called to work for healing and reconciliation. There are several Bible verses referenced, as you will note in the footnote of the hymn page.

What is it which proves devotion to God and neighbor? What are the marks of devotion?

Each week we pray for the needs of our church community, the greater world, and the greater good. This prayer is an intercessory prayer, where we pray to God to intercede on behalf of the needs of the world.




## Enneagram Workshop: A Deeper Dive


# I, the Lord of Sea and Sky

The stanzas here need to be understood as representing the voice of God, while the refrain (based on Isaiah 6:8) is the faithful human response to God's call. This becomes clearer if a leader or small group sings the stanzas, with the congregation joining on the refrain.

Guitar chords do not correspond with keyboard harmony.

This 20th-century text greatly enriches the neglected genre of urban hymns. The second stanza quotes John 9:4, the third stanza refers to Jesus weeping over Jerusalem (Matthew 23:37/Luke 13:34), and the final line cites the name given to Israel's future holy city (Ezekiel 48:35).
