Lenten Exhortation

As many of you know, I have been teaching a Bible Study on Philippians lately. I have enjoyed spending time in the study of the text. Studying the scriptures - and teaching them - are among the most fulfilling parts of ministry for me. Chapter 2 of Philippians begins with an exhortation - an ethical exhortation about Christian life and, more specifically, church life.

Philippians 2:1-4: "If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, ²make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. ⁴Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others."

I think about this text often when I see societal, ethnic, or church conflicts running wild. It is a beautiful, perfect exhortation. It is aspirational in the best sense. And yet, it is so hard to do. There is an old joke that wherever you find two pastors (or priests or coaches or lawyers – you can insert your own vocation) you will find at least three opinions.

How hard is it to share the "same mind" - to agree on thinking? Share the same love? Avoid selfish, self-serving choices while humbly putting the needs of others in front of our own. It reminds me of an old, old quote by the Englishman G.K. Chesterton that goes something like "The Christian life has not been tried and found wanting; instead, it has been found difficult and left untried." Living like the verses from Philippians are encouraging us to live is extremely difficult. So much so that I suspect that even the "best and brightest" Christians among us only achieve the verses lofty expectations on a few occasions.

And yet, we are nonetheless supposed to try. We make new year's resolutions or take on new habits for productivity, for balance of work and home, health and wholeness. But when was the last time we made a "faithfulness resolution"? Couldn't we all be more faithful if we resolved to try, to strive, for the types of Christian behavior that our verses encourage?

Everyone I know is worried about, and complains about, all the conflict in culture. But the conflict and discord are not magically going to solve themselves. Any solutions are going to take more than more hoping or more finger-pointing. Philippians 2 gives us a "map" of "what" we could do. The riddle to solve is "how" to do this.

For this month, as we begin Lent, I hope you'll join me in prayer about how all of us might more closely follow the exhortation of the text. It strikes me that if we valued the interests of others equal to or greater than our own, we might be able to bring moments of peace into an era far too consumed with conflict. One can only hope. And then try to do the work.

May Lenten grace abound,
