# In the Cross of Christ I Glory 213





This reflection on Christian vocation was written to provide a new text for a pre-existing tune, and the poet has crafted his words so well that the two parts mesh smoothly. The tune is named for a noted British boarding school, whose music director was a friend of the composer.



This majestic hymn celebrates the paradox that for Christians a means of painful death has been transformed into a symbol of renewed life; a sign of defeat has become an emblem of victory. With the cross traced on our foreheads at Baptism we are marked as Christ's own forever.

### CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

### **Vacation Bible School**

201 children, 59 youth helpers, 89 adult volunteers, 103 snack providers, and a multitude of staff members joyfully experienced our Hero Hotline VBS on June 19 – 23, 2023! Our church's children learned



stories about Bible heroes through daily assemblies, music, movement, art, science, and musical movement. They enjoyed playground time, snacks, and fellowship as they built their circle of friends. Our VBS children served others by bringing in supplies for and packing care bags for Triangle Family Services.

**Sunday School Young children, 2s - Kindergarten, gathered for Sunday School** which included Bible stories, arts and crafts, music and fellowship time. ### **Student Leadership Meetings**

Both the High School Leadership Team and the Middle School Leadership Team each had 31 meetings and a finale party. These teams meet each week on Zoom from September until May to learn leadership skills, plan youth group events, and help plan the retreats.

### **CONGREGATIONAL CARE**

Our Congregational Care Team welcomed a few new members to the team in 2023. We welcomed Lee Hunter as Pastoral Resident; Heather Garrabrant as the Health Ministry Coordinator; and Caroline Parker as Administrative Assistant for Congregational Care. The pastoral and program staff provided active and ongoing care, health resources, pastoral counseling, and grief support for members of our congregation.

**Congregational care offerings** included our Stephen Ministry program, Cancer Companions, Healing Through Grief groups, and Divorce groups. We continued programs for mental health and wellness and contemplative practices including Lectio Divina and Advent and Lenten contemplative etreats. Guest speakers were invited to speak on various topics such as aging & retirement and diet.

**The Diaconate supported congregation members** with bereavement care for those facing the loss of a loved one; new member care for those in their journey as official members; and care for new parents by encouraging community and connections.

**The Mental Health & Wellness Ministry** offered annual blood drives, a flu shot clinic, CPR training, and medical equipment on loan. Caregiver's coffee was a new offering to give those caring for a loved one with physical, developmental, mental health or aging related challenges, a chance to connect with other caregivers. Oncology Yoga was introduced as a new exercise class offering for survivors, thrivers, and caregivers.

### ADULT ENGAGEMENT AND FORMATION


The **Theologian in Residence program** brought author Karen Wright Marsh to campus to speak about her book *Vintage Saints and Sinners* in September. During her visit, she collaborated with Grier Booker Richards, Anne Galliher, and Karen Haneline to produce a small-group video curriculum called "Vintage Small Groups" to be used at WMPC and beyond.

In September, more than 150 people from WMPC and the surrounding community attended a documentary screening of At the River hosted by the MORE Ministry Team. Participants were able to engage the filmmaker and director Carolyn Crowder through a Q&A after the screening.

Under the guidance of the goals outlined in the "Be Thou My Vision document," WMPC discerned the need to hire an additional associate pastor. In October, Anne Galliher was called to be our Associate Pastor for Small Groups and Young Adults.

### **OUTREACH**

We raised \$122,059 for our 2023 Major Mission Partner SAFEchild. Through SAFEchild's new facility, children, families, and the community are served in a facility designed specifically for programs, security and confidentiality. The new facility also adds critical space for the SAFEchild Advocacy Center. The new building will feature three pediatric exam rooms and three interview rooms, immediately tripling capacity to 1,200 child evaluations per year and eliminating wait times.

**Tours of Nonprofit Organizations:** To help inform the vision of the Allocation Committee, tours were organized to 45 agencies supported by our church.

**Began evaluating the overall Outreach Committee structure** making sure we provide a meaningful experience for Outreach Leaders and Volunteers while effectively supporting the nonprofit community.

**Administrative:** Set up Salesforce to manage data for the 49 organizations served by White Memorial Presbyterian Church; Increased engagement with the different church teams; and identified volunteer recruitment as an area for improvement.
