Are We Ready?

Ready. Set. Go. Or, as we said growing up in South Louisiana, "geaux." That was the call at the start of relay races in PE. Do you remember Field Day at your school—the races and physical challenges? Whether you finished first, last, or somewhere in between (my usual spot), those words signaled the beginning of something special. They meant it was time to show up, try your best, and get moving.

I'm told that Ed Pickard, beloved pastor at White Memorial for nearly 30 years, used to say we suffered from "beach erosion" in the summer. And it's true—attendance dips as families travel, visit children and grandchildren, or head to the beach. (Or the mountains, in my case. I'll admit, I need too much sunscreen at the beach.)

Summer has a slower pace. Yet even then, life at White Memorial continues: weddings, funerals, and worship every Sunday—three services each week, except on holiday weekends when we gather for two.

While the church is very much alive in the summer, September always brings renewed energy. Choirs, children's and youth ministries, Bible studies, adult classes, support groups, and countless other opportunities return. Your Session and staff are ready. Our leaders are prepared. We're simply waiting for "go"—and it comes on September 7, Kickoff Sunday 2025. *Ready. Set. Go.* The new program year is here.

This fall, you'll hear about three important initiatives. I hope you'll give attention to all of them:

First: We're entering the second year of our **Worship +3** emphasis. The rhythm is simple: worship three times a month (in person or online), give generously, take an "inhale" by learning and being filled (like a Bible study), and then offer an "exhale" by serving, leading, or teaching. Worship +3 is a tried-and-true way to grow in faith. When we commit to it, we draw closer to God and to Jesus. Always have. Always will.

Second: You'll hear more about our **Four Pillars of Promise** Capital Campaign. This effort will refresh our sanctuary, provide life safety features to classrooms for our Weekday School and Sunday School, create a second Memorial Garden, and invest in our partnership with StepUp Ministry. It's a significant and exciting investment in our future. More details will come in October.

Third: You'll learn about **Cornerstone**, our 2026 budget initiative. Annual giving is what makes ministry possible. Inspired by the words of the Apostle Paul, we'll enter 2026—our 80th year of ministry in Raleigh—with purpose and inspiration.

Ready. Set. Go? I am. I believe we are. Let us live into God's future together.



White Memorial has a vibrant Stephen Ministry program and trained Stephen Ministers who would welcome the opportunity to walk with you during a difficult part of your life's journey.






