In you, Holy God, we live and move and have our being. You love, sustain, bless, comfort, and heal us. You are our God and we are your people.


Yet we struggle to live this truth. We choose our own paths, cling to half-truths, ignore suffering, and silence your Spirit within us.

These two hymns call us to worship with words from the psalms. "God Is Our Help" —Psalm 46—combines responsive reading and a plaintive sung refrain. "How Lovely, Lord"—Psalm 84—is set to an expansive tune by recently deceased composer Hal H. Hopson. Both hymns envision what the writer to the Hebrews calls, in today's text, "the city of the living God."

As with other choruses from the ecumenical French community Taizé, this short song's concise text gains power with repeated singing.

The English refrain consists of a twice-sung condensed paraphrase of Psalm 46:1–3. It works well, either alone or with a responsive reading, because it states so concisely the general theme illustrated by the list of natural and political calamities making up the rest of the psalm.

The author of this text, a Presbyterian minister and educator, was humming this tune as he began to create a paraphrase of Psalm 84 that would emphasize the beauty and peace of God's house. The tune is named for the composer's oldest sister, who was his first piano teacher.



Originally created in the Sotho language, this ecstatic South African hymn reached English by way of a Swedish translation and is now found in numerous hymnals. It can serve as a powerful sending hymn for connecting what happens at the Lord's Table with our mission in the world.



Drawing on language from 2 Corinthians 6:10 and 12:10 as well as Psalm 126:3, this short and repetitive song can be easily memorized. The simple vocabulary makes it suitable for multigenerational use, reminding all ages how gratitude for God's goodness changes our perspective.

Although it uses remarkably simple language, this text affirms a great mystery: beyond all our powers of explanation, God holds together all the opposites that seem to pull us in one direction or another. Yet God is present to them all and also to us; for that we give praise.
