Faith, Thanksgiving, and Cornerstones

In the life of faith, the practice of thanksgiving is one of the cornerstones. The entire house of faith is built upon the foundations of thanksgiving, grace, prayer, belief, trust, love, hope and generosity. As November dawns, and we have a National Day of Thanksgiving, it strikes me that taking each day during the month of November to pray a prayer of thanksgiving about some beautiful aspect of our lives would do us all some good. John Calvin, the reformer who inspired Presbyterianism described the life of faith as being built upon "grace and gratitude" that is, the grace of God and a life of thanksgiving in response to God's grace. Worship attendance continues to grow, our 2025 finances remain healthy, our youth and children's ministries are as vibrant as ever, and our music ministry is expanding. In addition to all of this, we have just called a new Associate Pastor for Outreach and Community Engagement, Austin Vernon. Austin, his wife, and young son (along with their three dogs) will be joining us in January. For all of this and more, we have an abundance of thanksgivings to offer.

God has surrounded us with an abundance of blessings. As Paul said, "You will be enriched in every way for you great generosity..." (2 Cor. 9:11) through sharing our blessings with the church, we are able to not only bless others but also ourselves.
