This We Know

How do we know what we know? Someone told us? We learned it in a book? Was it passed on by older people in the spirit of wisdom? Was it tested by the scientific method and proven by years of testing? How do we know what we know?

The reliability of knowledge is a key concept in classical philosophy, known as epistemology. For a long while, epistemology was easy. If it could be proven, then it was true. If it was passed on from ancient times and proved itself relevant and accurate, then it was true. Knowledge proven by fact or figure and/or wisdom passed on was considered reliable and trustworthy. Then the printing press came. Then the internet came. Then artificial intelligence came. A couple of thousand years, and suddenly we are back to debating how it is that "we know" what it is we think we know. We are back near the beginning, where the constancy of belief informs us of what is truly real and instructs us on how to organize all our knowledge.

One of the blessings of the Christian year is its reliability. No matter the chaos spinning around us, the Christian year continues to remind us of the great testimonies in support of God that we find in scripture, tradition, and history. Advent, proven reliable knowledge and practice by testimony, experience, and time arrives into our lives and focuses our gaze upon a hopeful future. A hopeful future which begins with a Christmas birth. And not just any birth.

This birth is celebrated by angels, wise men, and shepherds. In the light of Jesus' birth, kings and history alike bow low and worship in the footsteps of grace. This we know. And we know it in two parts. Advent prepares us for the future of hope, peace, joy, and love, which God desires for the world that God loves. And Christmas is both the confirmation and the arrival of that future. It is light in the darkness. It is the star shining brightly on the darkest nights of the year. It is laughter and song just when our collective conscience needs and desires it most.

The poet Christina Rosetti describes it like this:

"Our God, Heaven cannot hold Him, nor earth sustain; Heaven and earth shall flee away when He comes to reign. In the bleak midwinter a stable place sufficed The Lord God Almighty, Jesus Christ."

Beautiful words; true words. This we know: we need Christmas and all the promise it can infuse into our lives. Time and trust prove its efficacy. We need the longing gaze of Advent to focus our hopes upon the future which only God can provide. Ours is not to prove the practice of Advent. Ours is to take our place alongside believers of every time and station and lend our voices to the hymns of praise inspired by the angels.

Joy to the world, the Lord is come! Silent night, holy night! In the light of Christmas, Bethlehem is no simple little town, but the Advent of grace into our lives once again at precisely the time we need grace most to arrive. May your December days be filled with the depth, breadth, and wonder of God; with the knowledge and belief that you are loved as part of the world which God has both created and redeemed. Believe it. Know it.


Each week when school is in session, our church provides food-insecure children at Oberlin Middle and Lynn Road Elementary Schools with healthy meals and snacks.
