WORSHIP, MUSIC & ARTS

The **WMPC Worship Committee** is made up of several guilds and sub-committees that support worship services and the broader worship life of the congregation – extending to programs, retreats, conferences, seminars, and concerts. These guilds/sub-committees are Advent Wreath Guild; Baptismal Guild; Chancel Glorification Guild; Communion Guild; Concert Series Committee; Liturgical Arts Guild; Paraments Guild; Usher Guild; Wedding Guild; and Witness to the Resurrection Guild. All these groups have faithfully fulfilled their leadership through another year of worship.

The Worship Committee also oversees WMPC Music Ministry. Highlights from this ministry area include Eric Wall joining WMPC as the Director of Music and:

Sanctuary Worship has had a strong year of congregational song and musical ensembles; the choirs and ensembles have worked to be present in both 9:30 and 11:00. As we approach the sanctuary renovation, we're thankful for all that helps worship in that space be rich, expressive, powerful, and grounding; when the renovation is complete, we'll look forward not only to being reunited with the organ, but also to expanded chancel space and access and to a fresh, bright, familiar, and beautiful space.

Children's Choirs have had a wonderful year preparing music for both Sanctuary and OnPoint services. Members of the Joyful Noise Choir have participated in liturgy as part of our congregations's participation in the Presbyterian Association of Musicians' Child of Blessing Grant. Members of the Youth Choir recently participated in the Segue Choir Festival at Wake Forest Baptist Church with other area churches. It was a fun-filled day of singing and fellowship.

Participation in **OnPoint Band and Youth Worship Band** continue to be strong. Both groups have been working hard to learn new music and provide meaningful musical leadership. The Liturgical Arts Guild is taking on new projects and offering new classes this year. Be on the lookout for their offerings around the church!

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Vacation Bible School

88 children, 60 youth helpers, 82 adult volunteers, a multitude of snack providers, and many staff members joyfully experienced our Road Trip VBS on June 23 – 27, 2025! Our church's children learned Bible stories about God always being with us on our journey. Special activities included daily assemblies, music, movement, art, science, musical movement, and a service project. The children enjoyed playground time, snacks, and fellowship as they expanded their circle of friends. Our VBS children served others by bringing in supplies and packing bags full of snacks and fun items for Raleigh Rescue Mission and for our neighborhood fire station.

Sunday School – Two-year-olds through kindergarteners gathered each week for Sunday School, which included Bible stories, arts and crafts, music, and fellowship time. Elementary children in grades 1-5 explored Bible stories through Rotation Stations, visiting 6 stations: Science, Drama, Art, Prayer, Games, and Music. The children's offering supported Raleigh Rescue Mission.

YOUTH MINISTRY

New Year, New Titles and New Staff!

In 2025, our youth ministry staff experienced an exciting season of growth. Genevieve Brooks was promoted from Director of Youth Ministry to Director of Family Ministry, overseeing both the Children's Ministry Faith Formation Team and the Youth Ministry Team to support families from childhood through high school and emerging adulthood.

Bailey Morton became Director of Youth Ministry, leading the overall youth program while remaining the primary staff leader for high school students and their families. In July, Paige Hokunson joined as Assistant Director, working primarily with middle school students. Together, this team is leading meaningful, transformative ministry.

Student Leadership has reached new heights!

Thirteen high school seniors preached at Youth Sunday services, sharing faith and leadership with the congregation. Our Middle and High School Leadership Teams partner with staff to shape programming that meets students where they are, showing every young person they are known, valued, and belong.

Programming with depth and impact

In 2025, youth and families participated in 18 "Big Events," from the all-night Lock Out in January to middle schoolers serving at a soup kitchen in Charlotte. These experiences create lasting memories, strengthen relationships, and provide faith-expanding encounters with Christ. We are grateful for a congregation whose generosity makes these transformative experiences possible.



CONGREGATIONAL CARE

The **Congregational Care Team** continued to provide active and ongoing care, health resources, pastoral counseling, and grief support for members of our congregation.

The Diaconate supported congregation members with bereavement care for those facing the death of a loved one; new member care for those in their journey as official members; and care for new parents by encouraging community and connections.

Congregational care offerings included our Stephen Ministry program, Agape Care Teams, Cancer Companions, *Healing Through Grief* groups and home communion. We continued to offer contemplative practices including Lectio Divina, Centering Prayer and Advent and Lenten Contemplative Retreats.

We launched a new support group called **All Are Welcome** to provide love and support in a faith-based community for LGBTQ+ adults, and we hosted our second annual luncheon for survivors of suicide loss to support those who have lost a loved one to suicide.

Health Ministry offered annual blood drives, a flu shot clinic, CPR training, and medical equipment on loan. Caregiver's coffee continues to be a meaningful offering for those caring for a loved one with physical, developmental, mental health or aging related challenges and a chance to connect with other caregivers.

We featured new programs on **Spirituality and Health** and were blessed to host speakers Warren Kinghorn, who talked to us about "How Faith Connects us in a Disconnected World;" and Marilyn Hedgepeth, who offered a poetry reading from her beautiful book *The Lightness of Reprieve* just before her untimely death.

ADULT FORMATION AND ENGAGEMENT

The **MORE Ministry Team** continued with a set of local African American History Pilgrimage—one to Durham, where participants explored the historic Stagville Plantation and ventured down Black Wall Street; and another to downtown Greensboro for a guided tour of the International Civil Rights Center & Museum.

For the first time ever, staff and members from White Memorial Presbyterian Church, Christ Episcopal Church, Hayes Barton United Methodist Church, and St. Michael's Episcopal Church came together to plan and host **Together in Faith: An Evening for Women with Shauna Niequist**. About 500 women attended this event and many continued to meet in small groups afterward.

Our **Beyond Sunday @WMPC podcast** continues to thrive and be used as an innovative tool for faith formation. In 2025, we produced the 7-part series, *Lent for the Lost: Longing to be Found*. For the Summer we offered a 6-part series, *Things We Wish Jesus Hadn't Said*, which explored several of the hard sayings of Jesus. In the Fall, we kicked off the year with *Ready For It?* where titles of popular Taylor Swift songs were used to inspire rich theological conversation. And in December, we concluded with our 6-part Advent and Christmas series, *This We Know*.

Engagement at WMPC is at an all-time high, with the following groups meeting weekly or monthly:

- 7 Adult Sunday School Classes
- 9 Community Groups
- 7 weekly spiritual formation groups and Bible Study classes
- 1 monthly spiritual formation class
- 11 Presbyterian Women's Circles



OUTREACH

MM 2025 Update:

The new Knightdale campus of **Raleigh Rescue Mission, called The Garden**, will offer long-term transitional housing for up to 300 women and children each night. This represents a 450% increase over their current capacity to serve. **We raised \$116,961.72** to help towards their building project.

Pastoral Hire: Austin Vernon, a native of Kannapolis, North Carolina, came to us from Brownson Memorial Presbyterian Church in Southern Pines where he was their Associate Pastor for Discipleship and Missions. The search committee said that "When we interviewed Austin, everything felt right. His servant heart, warm spirit, and clear vision will lead and inspire us to walk respect

fully with all of God's people in our call to serve with them." He is excited about entering this new season of ministry with such a wonderful, caring, outreach-oriented congregation. Austin lives with his wife Abbey, their three-year-old son Wesley, and their three dogs.

Service Update

Provided approximately 2,000 **BackPack Buddies** bags to 60 food insecure children at two local schools. Focused collections on healthy foods allowed for increased member participation in the program and greater impact at partnered schools.

Outreach served our community in many ways this year. **Highlights include:** four Servant Saturdays, two Sunday Pop-Up projects, five church-wide

service projects, and numerous volunteer opportunities with local nonprofit partners. Outreach also funded critical in-kind donations and services for 32 local partners.

In collaboration with Hayes Barton neighbors, Outreach helped address hunger locally and globally—supporting the Hayes Barton Community Food Drive for InterAct's onsite pantry and partnering with Hayes Barton UMC to pack 10,000 Rise Against Hunger meals for distribution in the Philippines.

Outreach also **continued supporting Western North Carolina's recovery** from Hurricane Helene (2024), partnering with Note in the Pocket to prepare weekly donations.
