



April Showers

We all know the saying, “April showers bring May flowers.” It is tried and true, serving its proverbial lessons on two levels. Level one is a reminder that as seasons change, Mother Nature rules. As winter gives its grip over to spring, the skies open and the rain falls. Level two is a lesson in wisdom: the rain might be falling, and it might be cold and wet, but better days are ahead as long as we endure to see them. It is a reminder to “hang in there” through the storms. Or, as Annie sang, “the sun will come out tomorrow.”

But what happens when there is no rain in April? What happens when there is a drought? What happens when April brings water restrictions to the city we live in?


Even more importantly, when it comes to the spiritual life, what happens when our souls are in a drought? When everything is dry, when prayer feels empty, when the practice of our faith is like going through the motions? When life makes us feel trapped like a manufacturing line worker with little hope for change? How do we find hope in tomorrow, then?

There is no one, single, answer. No one, single, way to survive the spiritual drought. But I do think that whatever method we apply, whatever tasks we choose to jump start spiritual health, it will begin and end with Easter. Remember - Easter is not just one day. It is a season of the church lasting until Pentecost. Easter is hope beyond hope (John 14: 1-7). It is the promise of life beyond death. It is the promise of a new dawn after the darkest night. The promise of new life when we are in spiritual drought.

When in a spiritual drought, the best course of action is to hold fast and endure the challenge. Your drought may be personal: a loss of a job, a family member, a project you poured yourself into. Your drought may be out of your control, higher prices, local events, or even world events. Your drought might be internal, a struggle within yourself that is hidden from most everyone you know. Whatever it is, it's yours.

In such moments and times, surround yourselves with prayer. Remember Easter promises. Read the Psalms and the Gospels. Remember that others before you have survived such droughts before. Be brave, finding your courage in the Lord. Flowers will come. Not on our time, but on God's. And while it will be a test of patience, the flowers and the Spiritual healing will come. This promise is not an empty one, but one that is testified across the pages of Scripture and has sustained the Church and her people for more than 2,000 years. If you are reading this, you are part of that great testimony and story. Thanks be to God that we always have hope.

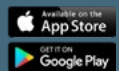

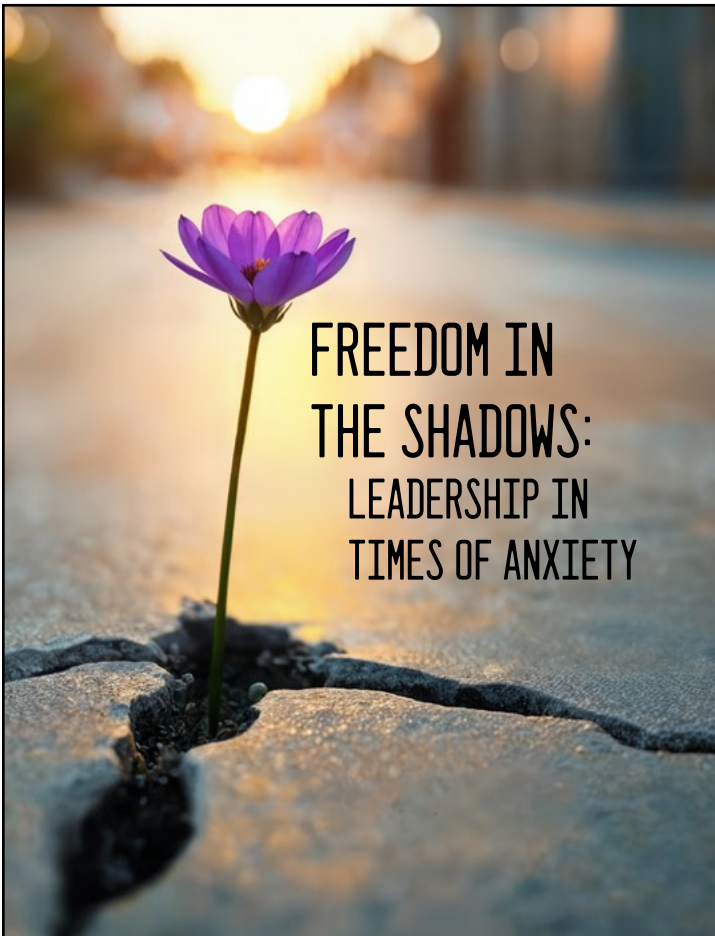
Each week when school is in session, our church provides food-insecure children at Oberlin Middle School and Lynn Road and Lacy Elementary Schools with healthy meals and snacks.
