## “O Lord, How Majestic”

As Spring gives way to Summer, the full majesty of our planet is on full display. Rich greens. Explosive flowers in their full bloom. Longer days. Warmer nights. Rarely (if not never) has there been a woman or man who didn't observe the changing of the seasons and did not ask the BIG questions: how is it all kept so perfectly in balance? Where do I fit into the grand story of creation and the beautiful purposes with which God created it in the beginning? The world is so big, and I (we) are so small, why should God care about us?

If you have ever thought about any of these questions, then Psalm 8 is your friend. We read Psalm 8 on May 31, on the cusp of June, and it is a work of genius. It is a tour de force of theology. It balances the questions we all ask about our own existence and the majesty of creation. Here are some selected verses:

*O LORD, our Sovereign,  
how majestic is your name in all the earth!  
You have set your glory above the heavens.  
When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers,  
the moon and the stars that you have established;  
what are human beings that you are mindful of them,  
mortals that you care for them?  
Yet you have made them a little lower than God,  
and crowned them with glory and honor.  
You have given them dominion over the works of your hands;  
you have put all things under their feet.*

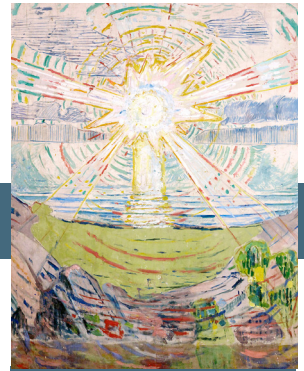
If you read it closely, you'll get the feel and the full picture of the awe we're supposed to have when we consider the vast dimensions of the universe. The bottom line: God is SO big! God is transcendent. Beyond our wildest mental calculations and imaginations.

And then, the Bible pulls in a totally different way. At the exact same time. All because, and we mean this, Jesus, who is the full expression of God's love, was human and close and tangible. People really touched him, ate with him, and listened to his voice. And so our belief is that God is transcendent (beyond our full understanding) and imminent (so close we can touch God and know God in Jesus). We believe in both of these understandings (transcendent and imminent) at the same time.

What this means for you and me is two-fold. First, that we can trust that God is worthy of our trust in the long arc of history, no matter how difficult our headlines may be. God is transcendent, beyond the limits of time and memory. And second, in terms of the imminence and relatability of God, we know and trust that Jesus felt all we felt and had all the joys of human life and sufferings of all humanity, and therefore, can relate to all the feelings we have in times of want and in times of plenty. It is indeed, as the great theologians said, when they read Psalm 8 (above) and words of Jesus, like "I am with you always, even until the end of the age." You see, both are true. And I take great confidence in knowing that while God is beyond history, God can also relate to all the things I think and feel and know in the one life on this earth I have been given. May it be so with all of you.

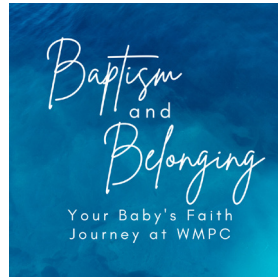

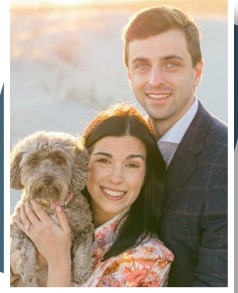

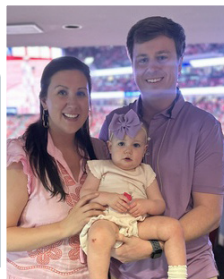
