For Small Group discussion & application this week:

Based on your personal time in Hebrews 9:1-28 this week, what did God teach you? Were there specific words, phrases or truths that stood out or you examined more?

What religious rituals, practices or traditions do you find yourself pursuing instead of, or in place of Jesus? Are there things you find yourself worshiping in place of Him?

What part of this passage is most personal to you? What do you see differently now in the text? How would you like this truth to affect your life?

How do you respond when you feel yourself unworthy of entering into the presence of Jesus to simply enjoy time with Him? What do you do at that moment?

What truth stood out to you from the message that you didn't get on your own? Why is that particular truth significant to you at this time and how will you apply it to your life?

Looking ahead: for next Sunday, April 10, take a closer look at Hebrews 10:1-25.

As you study the passage this week, ask the Lord to show you what difference it makes to you that Jesus is carrying out His duties as your Great High Priest.

As you examine 10:1-18, look at the absolute statements the author makes and make note of your observations. Here are a few key to consider:

The Old Covenant

- "it can never" (10:1)
- "it is impossible" (10:4)

The New Covenant

- "once for all" and "for all time" (10:10, 12)
- "forever" (10:14)
- "no more" (10:17)

Contrast the blessings of the new covenant we see in 15-18 with the shortcomings of the old covenant in 1-4.
