Based on your personal time in Hebrews 13 & Genesis 4 this week, what did God teach you?

Are there areas of your life that you are living in rebellion to Christ? How should you repent and deal with those things to walk with Christ?

Do you find yourself drifting in your relationship with Christ? How can you walk faithfully with Christ to grow? How can others encourage and support you in your walk with Christ?

What do you sense God leading you to risk by faith that you are hesitant or resistant to obey? What will your life look like to walk in obedience in this area?

What truth stood out to you from the message that you didn't get on your own? Why is that significant to you at this time and how can you act on that this week?

Make a commitment this week to memorize verse 6. Ask someone to do this with you and hold one another accountable.
