For Small Group discussion & application this week:

Based on your personal time in Judges 2:6-3:6 this week, what did God teach you?

How have you experienced the “cycle” that we learn about in the book of Judges? What did deception look like for you? How did you experience a season of desperation? How did deliverance come about? How have you experienced freedom and fulfillment in Christ?

How are you experiencing spiritual transformation? How is God leading you and growing you in His truth? How is that leading to gospel saturation in your daily life?

What did you take away from the message that you didn’t get on your own?

Looking ahead: for January 15, spend time this week in Judges 3:7-11.

Draw near to God asking Him to reveal truth to you. Seek understanding and application by asking a few questions as you read the text this week:

Reflect especially on the statements made about Israel in 3:7 (and again in v.12). What further significance do you see in these words?

What specific sins of the people are mentioned in 3:7?

In 3:8, what was God’s specific response to the people’s sin?

What do you see as your personal responsibility as a believer in Jesus Christ for not blending in to the culture around you? Where is the balance of not blending, yet having spiritual impact on the culture around you?

Look a bit further; In what important ways does Psalm 106:34-48 summarize Israel’s situation during this time period of the book of Judges?
