SHARE BACKGROUND AND PROVIDE CONTEXT TO THE BIBLE STORY.

In Chapter 5, Esther requests a meeting with the King and Haman. Haman sees this as a significant honor but continues to rage against Mordecai and constructs gallows to hang him. Mordecai's faith seemed sealed, but not for God! In Eastern courts, there are scribes or officers whose duty is to keep a journal of every occurrence worthy of notice. It has been a custom with Eastern Kings through all ages to have the annals of the kingdom read to them. Reviewing the history of a ruler's kingship and his ancestors provided guidance and instruction for how the king would lead in the future. There was, therefore, nothing uncommon for King Xerxes, calling for this journal. Unable to sleep that night, the king ordered the book read to him. The text explicitly directed his attention to Mordecai's unrewarded services; the immediate sovereignty of God is distinctly visible.
