# SHARE BACKGROUND AND PROVIDE CONTEXT TO THE BIBLE STORY.

In 1 Kings after King David's death, his son Solomon succeeded him and ruled over a united kingdom of Israel. Solomon's reign was marked by great prosperity and the construction of the temple in Jerusalem. However, after his death, the kingdom was divided into two: the northern kingdom of Israel and the southern kingdom of Judah. The northern kingdom was plagued by wicked kings who introduced idolatry and other false gods to Israel, one of whom was King Ahab. Ahab, who, along with his wife Jezebel, led the Israelites away from God, resulting in a drought and famine in the land. During this crisis, God sent the faithful prophet Elijah to confront King Ahab and the people of Israel and call them to repentance. The story of 1 Kings 17 begins with God speaking to Elijah and telling him to go to a place called Kerith, where he would be fed by ravens and drink from a brook.
