TOPIC: BENEFIT OF THE DOUBT

THEME: I DOUBT THAT DEAD THINGS COME BACK TO LIFE

TAKEAWAY: WE WILL BELIEVE, BEFORE WE SEE!

SHARE BACKGROUND AND PROVIDE CONTEXT TO THE BIBLE STORY.

Thomas, one of Jesus' disciples, struggled to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. Before this event, Jesus had been crucified and buried, and his followers were devastated by his death.

Thomas, so often remembered as "Doubting Thomas," deserves to be respected for his faith. He was a doubter, but his doubts had a purpose; he wanted to know the truth. Doubting was only his way of responding, not his way of life. Although our glimpses of Thomas are brief, his character consistently comes through. Despite what he felt, he struggled to be faithful to what he knew. At one point, when it was plain to everyone that Jesus' life was in danger, only Thomas put into words what most were feeling, "Let's go, too--and die with Jesus" (John 11:16). He didn't hesitate to follow Jesus. The story of Thomas is a powerful reminder of the importance of faith in Christianity. It also highlights the doubts and struggles that even the most devoted followers of Jesus may experience.
