
## **Week #13**

## Share background and provide context to the bible story

In this passage, Paul arrives in Athens, a city known for its intellectual pursuits and philosophical debates. There, he encounters Athenians, including Epicureans who prioritized pleasure and rejected the idea of resurrection, and Stoics who valued reason and self-sufficiency while also denying an afterlife. Brought before the Areopagus, the Athenian council overseeing religion and education, Paul speaks about a God previously unknown to them and the concept of resurrection.
