

MET Worship Dress Code

As leaders on stage, what we wear matters. It helps us create a distraction-free space where people can focus on Jesus. Our goal isn't to restrict style but to reflect unity, modesty, and excellence as we lead in worship.

General Guidelines for Everyone:

- Clothing should be clean, modest, and intentional—not overly casual or overly trendy.
- Avoid anything too tight, sheer, low-cut, or cropped.
- Sleeveless tops aren't permitted (regardless of gender).
- Please choose simple logos that are MET or faith-based, and avoid large prints or bold designs, as they
 can be distracting on camera.
- Hats are allowed if they don't block your face or distract under lights.
- Shoes should be closed-toe and clean, think stage-appropriate and polished.

Additional Notes for Women:

- No crop tops, deep necklines, or sheer clothing.
- If wearing leggings or tights, cover the backside with a tunic or long top.
- Dresses and skirts should stay modest, even when moving.
- Keep jewelry and accessories simple to avoid distraction.

Additional Notes for Men:

- No sleeveless shirts, tanks, or muscle tees.
- Pants should fit well and be worn at the waist.
- Shirts should follow the same modesty and branding guidelines above.

Stage & Lighting Considerations:

- Be aware that lights and cameras can make clothing more revealing than expected.
- If you're unsure about an outfit, ask a team leader before Sunday.

Team Coordination:

When color themes or style suggestions are given, follow them as best as you can. If nothing is specified, black or neutral attire is always a safe choice.

Examples of common themes:

- Black & denim
- Earth tones
- MET Worship apparel
