When you think about your hometown, what is one need you wish could be met for the people who live there?

Share background and provide context to the Bible story.

Jesus sent out seventy-two disciples as His representatives into nearby towns and villages. The land was under foreign control, burdened by taxes and tensions among religious leaders. Most families survived through farming or trade, and hospitality, sharing meals and opening homes, was a vital part of life. The hope for God's Kingdom was strong, though divided: some looked for rebellion, others longed for renewal.

Into this setting, Jesus gave His followers a clear call. They were not to carry extra supplies or depend on their own resources. Instead, they were to trust God fully, relying on the welcome of households and living with humility. Jesus invited His disciples to join God's mission of restoration and carry hope across barriers of class, culture, and expectation.
