Share background and provide context to the Bible story.

Genesis 2 was written in a context shaped by ancient Near Eastern culture, where stories of creation and origins were central to religious and political identity. The story echoes Mesopotamian traditions that emphasized humanity's connection to the soil, Adam is formed from adamah, the Hebrew word for ground, reinforcing a bond between people and land. The text predates the centralized Israelite monarchy but subtly affirms divine sovereignty by portraying God as a personal, hands-on creator rather than a distant ruler. The garden setting evokes temple imagery, suggesting sacred space and divine presence, which later shaped Israel's understanding of worship and holiness. Israel is invited to see themselves as created for relationship, calling, and sacred work under the guidance of one sovereign God - and now the story from God's Word
