Genesis 3 reveals the entrance of sin into the world through Adam and Eve's disobedience. God created mankind in His image and placed them in the Garden of Eden. They lived in perfect harmony with creation, with God, and with each other, representing God's intended design for human relationships The introduction of the serpent brings spiritual deception, challenging the goodness of God's Word and leading humanity into sin. The serpent's deception illustrates Satan's ongoing strategy to undermine God's Word. The serpent is not a mythological figure but the adversary of God, whose deception brought devastating consequences ...and now the story from God's Word.
