Share background and provide context to the Bible story.

Scripture presents God's creation of the heavens and earth by His spoken word, establishing the universe from nothing. God creates light, separates waters, forms dry land, and brings forth plants, sun, moon, stars, fish, birds, and animals. Adam was created for an intimate relationship with God, given stewardship over creation, and blessed to multiply and fill the earth. God gives Adam responsibility and moral freedom, instructing him not to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, warning of death if he disobeys. Eve is created as a companion for Adam, forming the first marriage, reflecting God's design. The serpent, understood to be Satan, successfully tempted Eve by questioning God's word, denying the consequences of sin, and leading both her and Adam to rebel against their Creator...and now the story from God's Word.
