Share background and provide context to the Bible story.

Genesis was written by Moses under the inspiration of God during Israel's wilderness journey after the exodus from Egypt. Israel was surrounded by pagan nations whose creation stories were filled with myths, idols, and false gods, in contrast to Israel's account of the one true God as Creator. Israel was being formed into a covenant nation under God's law, distinct from surrounding peoples and their practices. The creation account reflects the beginning of God's dealings with mankind, the seriousness of sin, and the establishment of divine order in the world. The Garden of Eden narrative set Israel apart from pagan fertility cults by grounding human origins, marriage, work, and worship in God's design rather than man-made deities. The passage was foundational for Israel's understanding of humanity, sin, and God's holiness in contrast to the religious corruption of surrounding nations...and now the story from God's Word
