What's something you've followed an influencer, a brand, or a trend that seemed exciting at first but didn't last?

Share background and provide context to the Bible story.

Jesus begins His public ministry in Galilee, a region known for its cultural diversity, where Jews lived alongside Gentiles. Galileans demonstrated deep devotion to Torah observance through their use of stone vessels for ritual purity, construction of mikva'ot (ritual immersion pools), avoidance of pork, regular pilgrimages to Jerusalem's temple, and active participation in synagogue life. Galilee was sustained by fishing and agriculture. Fishing was physically demanding and economically uncertain, so fishermen were respected but not powerful. His move to Capernaum by the sea fulfills Isaiah's prophecy, signaling that light is dawning in a spiritually dark place. Rabbis typically waited for disciples to seek them out, but Jesus initiates the call, breaking tradition and demonstrating the grace and authority of His Kingdom.
