Ask a thought-provoking question to get the group focused

Who is someone who once believed in you and helped you grow in your faith or life? What did they do that made the biggest difference?

Share background and provide context to the Bible story.

Hospitality was a sacred duty in Jewish life, and travelers depended on the generosity of local homes for food and lodging, hence Jesus' instruction to "eat what is set before you." There was a clear divide between Jews, Samaritans, and Gentiles, yet Jesus' mission symbolically included all people, foreshadowing the global reach of the gospel. Most villages were made up of poor farmers, fishermen, and laborers; Jesus' command emphasized trust in God's provision, not material security. The people were steeped in synagogue worship and ritual purity laws, but the Pharisees and priests often emphasized tradition over compassion, which Jesus' message of peace directly challenged. This took place late in Jesus' ministry as He journeyed toward Jerusalem, a commissioning that previewed the Church's later missionary move.
