Looking Back

In Ephesians 6:10–20, Paul concludes his letter with a powerful exhortation: to “be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power” and to put on the “armor of God.” Drawing on the imagery of a Roman soldier, a familiar sight to his readers, Paul describes the spiritual resources available to Christians for resisting the devil’s schemes. This passage reflects the reality of spiritual warfare in the life of every believer, urging vigilance, prayer, and steadfastness. It also underscores that our struggle is not against people but against spiritual forces, reminding the church of their unseen battle and the source of their strength.

Diving Deeper

- 1) Why do you think Paul uses military imagery to describe spiritual life?
- 2) What do you think it means to “stand firm” spiritually in today’s culture?
- 3) What might it look like to “put on the full armor of God” in practical, everyday terms?
- 4) Why do you think Paul closes this letter with such a vivid and urgent appeal?
- 5) Where in your life do you feel spiritually vulnerable, and how can God's armor protect you there?
- 6) How has God strengthened you in a past spiritual battle, and what did you learn about Him through it?
- 7) Who in your life needs encouragement to “stand firm,” and how might you support them this week?
